We carry out genetic mutation studies for inflammatory bowel disease, as there are many mutations in this condition.

We carry out family counselling to exclude if a parent, sibling or child has the disease.

Our expert team will follow you up carefully to ensure that you do not develop the known complications from this disease.

Diagnosis of Colorectal cancer In India, 7.2 per 100,000 men in the population and 5.1 per 100,000 women are affected by colorectal cancer. Colorectal cancer ranks within the top 4 deadliest cancer cancers in India. Once the diagnosis of colorectal cancer is confirmed after the biopsy, our pathologists will carry out sophisticated tests to provide the results to our multidisciplinary team who will discuss every case and plan the treatment.

This would be explained in detail to the patient and family. Staging of the disease will be undertaken using all the available facilities in our state of the art facility at Continental Hospital.

The treatment may involve surgery, chemotherapy, radiotherapy, immunotherapy or a combination depending on the stage of the cancer and if it has spread to other parts of the body. COLORECTAL CANCER

- It is a cancer which arises from COLON/RECTUM This cancer arises from polyps which are like grapes arising from within the colon, sometimes occurring in families.
- These polyps May be initially benign and over time can become cancerous. Colon cancer is CURABLE if detected early.
- Our recommendation is per international guidelines-Start screening at 45 years and earlier at 40 if there is family history, known genetic

CONDITIONS

- Incidence of Colorectal cancer is rising globally in younger age groupIn those with African ancestry, \ incidence of colon cancer is higher.
- Risk factors in Colorectal Cancer;
- At age 50 or older , risks increase for developing colorectal cancer

SMOKING

• Obesity, overweight Physically inactive, sedentary life style

TYPE 2 DIABETES

- Long standing Inflammatory bowel disease (Crohn's disease, ulcerative colitis)
- Those known to have genetic mutations eg Lynch syndrome
- Increased alcohol intake, red meat intake

- Quit smoking or reduce drastically
- Do not indulge in intake of processed meat, reduce red meat intake, increase intake of fresh fruits and vegetables Maintain a healthy weight, active daily exercises, do not lead a sedentary life style Increase intake of fiber, whole grains Undergo regular screening as advised by your health care provider
- Commence screening at an earlier age if you have family history as advised by your health care provider.
